

- District 3 - There is a lot of concern regarding the Reber PUD; an ad hoc committee has been formed and has hired legal representation to look at challenging the subdivision.
- District 4 - Bill Roberts looked into sewer problems in District 4 and discussed them with the Engineering Department. City Manager Burton spoke to the issue at the monthly meeting with HCC members and stated the city is not a bank and does not loan money. It was also noted that the city would not bury inefficient sewer line and is willing to work with property owners when the situation (rarely) occurs. There is concern with an abandoned house in District 4; Bill Roberts will look into it.
- District 5 - There are over twelve commercial and residential developments occurring in the district. There are also large projects underway, stormwater drainage improvements and planning for the Custer Interchange. There is still a lot of concern for traffic in the area. There is also concern for some new commercial developments, but private land is under private ownership; its development is based on law, not what concerned citizens would like to see happen.
- District 6 - The Midtown Group continues to meet and is working on the details of the neighborhood plan.
- District 7 - The neighborhood continues to meet and work on the Janet Street Park proposal. The next meeting with City Parks & Recreation Director Randy Lilje will be in June.

Quality of Life Committee - the next meeting is June 5, 2007 at 6:00pm at Firetower Coffee.

City Budget Meetings - Larry Mitchell, Marhsall Gingery and Bill Roberts have been attending the meetings.

UWTF - the task force recommendation will be considered at the June 4, 2007 City Commission Meeting. There is a good possibility the task force will be ongoing.

Old Business

VISTA - the VISTA office did not recommend the hiring of the first candidate. The committee will move forward interviewing other candidates.

Walking Mall Clean Up - will be held June 10,2007 at 1:00pm.

Trolley restoration - George Hoff encouraged everyone to view the new MT Historical Society display downtown. He invited council members to attend a party for the trolley restoration on May 24, 2007 from 4:00 - 7:00pm at Capital High School.

New Business (Open Discussion)

Neighborhood meetings - Discussion was held on citizen's perception of lack of city action. Also, there is a lot of concern for neighborhood specific issues. It was suggested that in between the quarterly meetings would be a good time to follow up on neighborhood questions

and concerns; members can report back to citizens at the next meeting. City tax spending and services should be discussed at the July meeting.

VISTA - Discussion was held on tasking the individual, there must be enough council follow-through to provide tasks and sustain the workload. It was noted guidance and direction will need to continue through Executive Board and HCC member turnover. Suggestions of duties and goals were given and discussed; it was the consensus of the members that the council is ready to sustain a VISTA employee.

Concerns were voiced regarding what the HCC's job is, where the council is going in the future and where it fits in with the city.
